World Consumer Rights Day was inspired by President John F Kennedy, who sent a special message to the US Congress on 14th March 1962, in which he formally addressed the issue of consumer rights. He was the first world leader to do so. The consumer movement first marked that date in 1983 and now uses the day every year to mobilise action on important issues and campaigns.
