Scholarship coverage

Krishna Reddy THATHIREDDY, from now on referred to as the "Grantee" is awarded with a Scholarship in the framework of the BRAVE Project, which will cover a monthly subsistence allowance, travel costs (one return, i.e. round ticket, economy class) and full health insurance throughout the duration of the scholarship. The ticket will be provided by the Coordinator. If the Grantee buys a flight ticket on his/her own, he/she will not be reimbursed by the Consortium for the related expense. Visa permit costs shall be advanced by the Grantee. Costs related to the visa permit for Grantee are covered by this Project. The Coordinator will reimburse the fee against original receipts that must be sent directly to the Coordinator together with the used boarding passes and travel tickets.

The Grantee will not be required to pay any fees or other participation cost. The Scholarship will financially support the period of studies and/or research, teaching or other relevant programme at the Host University, for the period of studies or research previously agreed on with the Host University.

Monthly subsistence allowance: 1500€ / month

The Grantee will receive upon arrival two months' allowance to cover installation costs. The remaining part of the subsistence allowance will be paid, on a regular monthly basis, to a European Union bank account that the Grantee will open in the host country. The host University will provide all necessary assistance. Once the account is opened, the Grantee must supply the bank information to the Host University.

The Grantee may not receive additional funding from other European Union sources/programmes.

Attendance obligations

The Grantee must respect the mobility start and end dates. In case of earlier Scholarship termination, a monthly allowance will be paid in full if the portion of the last of permanence is more than 15 days. If the portion of the last of permanence is less or equal to 15 days, no monthly allowance will be paid.

Concerning holidays, the general policy of the Host University applied on other grantees working on stipends will apply. Apart from the regular holidays, the Grantee is not expected to leave the Host University during the mobility period. A scholarship can be put on hold if the student has to temporarily leave the host institutions following duly justified and well documented reasons (i.e. illness, etc). In that case, the scholarship payment must be interrupted until she/he has returned to the host institution and can actively participate in the activities. An extension of the originally agreed eligibility period can only be granted if the interruption is due to reasons of individual force majeure, subject to the approval of the host, the coordinating Institutions and the EACEA. Leave or absence from the host university due to academic reasons can only be authorized by the Host University, after approval by the Coordinator and the EACEA.

In any case, travel costs other than the original return ticket will not be covered by BRAVE.

Research Plan

A research plan describing the planned research activities must be made within the first month of the Grantees presence in the host University.





The original proposed research plan can be changed once subject to the approval of host Institution. The Coordinator needs to be informed of such a research plan change.

Scholarship Termination

The Scholarship may be terminated if:

- The Grantee withdraws from the project, also in case of force majeure;
- The Grantee does not comply with the regulations set in this Agreement;
- The Grantee does not fulfill the requirement of his study/work programme;
- The Grantee does not comply with the internal regulations of the Host University.

In the case of Scholarship termination, the Consortium will suspend the payment of the scholarship and may demand the reimbursement of the Scholarship, in part or in full.

Any change or interruption to the agreed programme, mobility dates, changes of supervisor or other, should be promptly communicated to the Local Coordinator of BRAVE and will be subject to the approval of the Consortium and the EACEA. In case of a withdrawal, the Grantee must notify the BRAVE Coordinator with an official letter stating the reason of withdrawal.

I, Krishna Reddy THATHIREDDY, accept the scholarship under the conditions specified above.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU) BETWEEN

AGRICULTURAL UNIVERSITY OF ATHENS (AUA) OF THE HELLENIC REPUBLIC, ATHENS

AND

SRI VENKATESWARA UNIVERSITY (SVU), TIRUPATI, ANDHRA PRADESH, INDIA

The Agricultural University of Athens and the Sri Venkateswara University (hereinafter referred to as the "Parties")

Having an intention to establish the scientific and research cooperation having decided to sign the present Agreement between the Government of the Hellenic Republic and the Government of Andhra Pradesh, India.

For the purpose of promoting educational and scientific exchange and cooperation in the field of Agricultural Sciences.

Have agreed as follows:

ARTICLE 1

The Parties agree, in accordance with their respective interests and capabilities, to encourage and develop educational, scientific and research cooperation between the two Universities on the basis of equality and mutual benefit.

ARTICLE 2

The cooperation between the two Parties in the field of Agricultural Sciences shall be carried out in the following areas:

Crop Science, Plant Biotechnology, Plant Virology.

The Parties may explore other fields of cooperation after mutual consent.

ARTICLE 3

The Parties shall, on a reciprocal basis, undertake such cooperation in the following forms:

- Exchanges of students, academic staff members, researchers and administrative personnel
- Implementation of joint research on projects of common interest
- Organization of training programs, seminars, conferences and academic meetings in either of the two Countries
- Exchange of technical information, publications, patents and any intellectual properties, documents and other research outputs.

ARTICLE 4

Regarding the academic staff exchange program and joint research, Parties further agree that:

- The hosting Party will provide a university appointment, library and research facilities, and other assistance as far as possible.
- The sending Party will maintain its academic staff on full salary during the period of the exchange and will cover the travel and accommodation expenses.
- Visiting participants will be responsible to obtain the necessary insurance coverage.
 The hosting university cannot be held responsible for any damage suffered or caused by visitors.
- Visitors will be abiding by the rules and regulations of the host university and by the national laws.

ARTICLE 5

Regarding students' exchange programs, Parties also agree that:

Expenses for insurance travel and accommodation in the host country will be the responsibility of the participating student. It will be optional for each Party to cover part of the expenses of its own students.

ARTICLE 6

Information concerning the types of training involved and their accessibility, the kinds of certificates to be issued and information about research programs and the research teams involved will be systematically exchanged between the two Parties.

ARTICLE 7

The Parties share the joint achievements. They are responsible for neither transferring nor publicizing the information provided by both Parties and achievements through cooperation to a third Party, unless the common consensus in writing granted in advance.

ARTICLE 8

The terms of cooperation for each specific activity implemented under this Bilateral Cooperation Agreement shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing by both Parties prior to the initiation of that activity. Any such agreement entered into force, as outlined above, will form an Appendix to this Bilateral Cooperation Agreement.

ARTICLE 9

Each Party shall nominate one of its members as its representative in charge of the cooperation programme.

The International Relations Office of the Agricultural University of Athens and the International Relations Office of Sri Venkateswara University will be the contact points between the Parties and responsible for the co-ordination of the specific activities agreed upon.

Through the International Relations Offices, both Parties may initiate proposals for activities and specific details of any such activities will be set forth in the Appendixes.

ARTICLE 10

This Agreement shall enter into force on the day of its signing by both Parties and shall remain valid for a period of 5 years and may be revised or automatically prolonged for a period of 3 years, unless either of the two Parties gives the other written notice six months prior to the expiring date.

- To support the mutual interests of both parties, the following will be instituted.
 - Sharing of research facilities;
 - Research collaboration and/or joint research projects;
 - Organization of lectures and joint symposia;
 - In case one institution permits the use of its equipment, facilities, manpower etc. to the other party for executing projects, modalities of payment and all other related aspects would be worked out mutually .

3. Non-Exclusivity:

The agreement reflected by the provisions of this MoU are non- exclusive in nature and both the parties can enter into cooperative arrangements with other parties to suit their organizational needs. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN

SRI VENKATESWARA UNIVERSITY Tirupathi, Andhra Pradesh

INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE MISSION

SRI VENKATESWARA UNIVERSITY with NAAC A+ grade was established in 1954 in the world famous holy temple town of Tirupati on the sprawling campus of 1000 acres with a panoramic and pleasant hill view. The "Objectives of the University" are to increase the capacity of well-rounded faculty through innovative Pedagogy, Training, Research and consultancy for meeting the needs of the industry and achieving societal values, so as to advance the knowledge and dedication of the students in Science, Technology and other areas of Scholarship that will best serve the Nation and the World in the 21st Century.

The range of subject departments, courses and research programmes undertaken and promoted during the last 60 years reflect Sri Venkateswara University's commitment in promoting socially relevant and inter-disciplinary programmes. The University has 4 constituent colleges and 132 affiliated colleges concerning various conventional and advanced subjects, in order to provide good academic and smooth administrative service to one and all. The University has 54 departments, where in 72 different PG Courses, and several Diploma and Certificate courses are offered. The University has been moving forwards in achieving academic excellence with a strong commitment and dedicated approach, by clearly setting up of a vision of its own. The initiatives taken by the Vice-Chancellor have already started yielding excellent results, in terms of research funding, extension activities keeping the University on the path of excellence.

INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE MISSION (IJM), is a global not-for-profit organization that collaborates with governments in protecting vulnerable citizens from violence and oppression, irrespective of their gender, community, caste, race and ethnicity. IJM's mission is to protect people in poverty from violence by rescuing victims, bringing the criminals to justice, restoring survivors to safety and strength, and helping local law enforcement build a safe future that lasts. IJM liaises with governments, civil society organisations and likeminded institutions to comprehensively address the issues of bonded labour and human trafficking in India.

I: SCOPE OF THE MoU

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred as MoU) is signed between Sri Venkateswara University, Tirupati (hereinafter referred to as Sri Venkateswara University) as First Party and International Justice Mission (hereinafter referred as IJM) as Second Party (hereinafter referred as Parties) for the purpose of Academic and Research collaboration with each other on areas pertaining to Human Rights especially focused on issues of bonded labour and human trafficking. In addition to this, active efforts will be made to develop joint events and research program that will be pursued in a collaborative spirit. For the purpose of this MoU, Sri Venkateswara University shall mean any department, school or centre established or recognized as a part of Sri Venkateswara University, Tirupati.

This MoU defines the overall relationship between the Parties and sets forth a standard framework for administration, reporting and accountability, within which individual projects and initiatives shall be pursued.

II: OBJECTIVE

The objective of this MoU is to outline the possible ways in which SRI VENKATESWARA UNIVERSITY, Tirupati and INTERNATIONAL JUSTICE MISSION develop and carry out collaborative activities. Dr.T.Chandrasekarayya,

Associate Professor, Department of Population Studies and SOCIAL WORK, SV UNIVERSITY will be the Coordinator for the activities.

III: PURPOSE OF THE MOU

- 1. This memorandum of understanding sets out the terms and responsibilities by which the Parties will work in close collaboration.
- 2. The MoU provides for broad-based initiatives between the Parties. The MoU establishes a foundation for a more robust future relationship between the two Parties. It reflects a shared value and focus for seeking joint opportunities between Parties towards their respective vision, mission, and program focus.
- 3. The purpose of the MoU is to specify the roles and responsibilities of the Parties in relation to working to combat human trafficking.

IV: SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES/PROJECTS

The scope of collaboration on academic and research activities/projects under this MOU may include, but is not limited to the following:

- 1. Student internships;
- Formation and implementation of Anti-human Trafficking Clubs (AHTCs) in the 4 colleges in the university campus and all the affiliated colleges in Chittoor District.
- 3. Exchange of scholarly publication and information;
- 4. Collaborative research programs or projects in the field of bonded labour, human trafficking and related issues, including but not limited to, women and children;
- 5. Collaboratively organize and co-sponsor academic discourse such as symposia, seminars, workshops, conferences and training programs;
- 6. Cooperation in the development of education generally, including the potential of offering joint programs.

Each activity/project developed or to be developed under this MoU shall also contain a detailed plan of action, budget along with the roles and responsibilities mutually agreed upon in writing by both the Parties. Further, it is to be understood that the activities/projects related to this MoU shall begin and end at various times within the duration of this MoU. Such dates (and any changes that may be mutually agreed) shall be reflected in the activity/project descriptions. Additional areas of cooperation may be appended by written consent of both the Parties.

V: JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES

The Parties shall work closely in partnership for the implementation for this MoU. More specifically, the Parties shall:

- 1. Implement the MoU in accordance with its term and the project;
- 2. Prioritize the creation of project description sheets/one-page concept note, for particular initiatives which will be treated as annexes to this MoU. Each project description sheet will contain specific objectives and its own Plan of Action, mutually agreed between the Parties with corresponding roles and responsibilities;
- 3. Subject to availability of resources, allocate the necessary financial, technical and personnel means and other resources required for the implementation of the MoU promptly, and in compliance with the project description sheets and related plans of action;
- 4. Ensure that the staff and students are involved in the implementation of this MoU. That the respective activity/project heads of both Parties are briefed and aware of the terms of the partnership/collaboration and contribute to the strengthening of the partnership between the two institutions;
- 5. Produce and share, where applicable, quarterly narrative and financial reports on projects covered by this MoU, based on mutually agreed formats and procedures.

VE TERMS OF MOU

Progress in realizing the terms and conditions referred to herein will be reviewed periodically as mutually agreed and the memorandum may be amended at any time by mutual consent and in writing.

IJM may, for any reason and in its sole discretion, elect to execute the terms of this MoU through a different agent, branch office, employee, subsidiary, affiliate, or entity.

Both Parties reserve the right to terminate this Memorandum by giving six months written notice to the other. The implementation and/or continuance of the program or projects established pursuant to this Memorandum prior to the effective date of termination shall not be affected by the termination of this Memorandum.

VII: ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION

This MoU may be executed by a party and delivered by a facsimile or electronically in portable document format (PDF) and if so executed and delivered this MoU or such counterpart will for all purposes be as effective as if the party had executed and delivered the MOU or a counterpart bearing an original signature.

VIII: INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY AND CONFIDENTIALITY

- 1. In respect of each project and program, the Parties shall negotiate and mutually agree in writing on their respective rights to the intellectual property and commercial exploitation of the same (including without limitation, trademarks and service marks, copyrights, patents, designs and confidential information pertaining thereto).
- 2. Neither Party shall, at any time disclose to any third party any confidential information of the other party which is acquired in the course of activities under this Memorandum, a collaborative project or a program, without the prior consent of other part in writing.

The confidentiality obligations herein shall not apply to information in public domain; information in the possession of the receiving Party prior to the disclosure of the information; information which is independently developed by the receiving Party; information required to be release by law; and information which is rightfully received by the receiving Party for third parties without any breach of confidentiality obligations.

IX: NON-BINDING NATURE OF MEMORANDUM

Nothing in this Memorandum shall be construed as creating any contract, partnership or agency between the Parties. Further, the Parties agree that the provisions contained in this MoU do not create any legal obligations between the Parties, save for the confidentiality provisions in the MoU. This Memorandum is only a non-binding statement of intent to foster genuine and mutually beneficial academic collaboration. Signing of this MOU does not result in any material, financial or other obligation for either of the Parties hereto. Specific initiatives may be considered and agreed upon, a case by case basis, including the contributions and obligations of each institution. Subsidiary agreements may be signed as required.

X: NON-EXECLUSIVITY

Either Party may enter into similar arrangements with any other person or third party, subject always to maintain the confidentiality of the obligations stated herein.

XI: LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY

Except for claims that may arise pursuant to confidentiality clause, in no event shall either Party be liable to the other for any damages including, without limitation, direct, speculative, indirect, incidental, special or consequential damages in connection with this MoU.

Xm: MODIFICATIONS

No variations, modifications or alterations of any provision of this MoU shall be made unless by prior written agreement of the Parties.

XIII: TERMINATION


- 1. This memorandum shall come into force immediately upon its signature by the Parties.
