

CENTRE FOR EXTENSION STUDIES

The objective of the programme is to support sustainable human and ecological use and reuse of remediated land; minimize impacts to water quality and water resources; Reduce air toxics emissions and greenhouse gas production; minimize material use and waste production and Conserve natural resources and energy. **100 students** participated and cleaned the area. Later planted trees together.



5 Information Dissemination Programme was organised by Centre for Extension studies on Organic Farming to local farmers of a rural community on **15.2.2021**. The objectives of the Awareness Programme were to provide information on organic farming techniques, rain water harvesting and effluent treatment. The main objectives of the programme were to explain to the participants, about the ill effects of chemicals used on the crops in their fields. The faculty explained that when chemicals were used in farming they gradually reduced the effective production capacity of the soil and more and more chemicals had to be applied to produce the same output. Whereas Organic methods were ideal to maintain the level of soil capacity in terms of production to the **20 farmers** attended the programme.
