Introduction to Dairy farm and Advantages of Dairy, Past and present status of production in dairy farm development in national level, Economic traits of dairy cattle, Sheep and Goats, Classification of dairy animals such as Indigenous, Exotic, Cross breeds (Indian cattle and Buffalo breeds).
